- **Association Dues Assessment**

With the adoption of the budget as presented, the following dues assessment will be in effect for 2018-2019. It is expected that these changes will be reflected on the May 18, 2018 pay.

BU #1 – Clinical Nursing Instructor	\$18.09
BU #1 – Sessional Instructor	\$55.66 <i>*Per course</i>
BU#2 – Clinical Veterinary Professional	\$33.23

As in the past, all Members (both Bargaining Units) with a FTE of 0.5 or less are to be charged at 50% of the rates given above. This reduction does not apply, however, to the “per course” charge for Sessional Instructors.

Notes:

- 1) *These dues are tax deductible.*
- 2) *Dues for Members with appointments of 0.5 FTE or less will be 50% of the above rates. This, however, does not apply to the per course rate for Sessional Instructors.*
